Transport is the main source of greenhouse gas emissions in the tourism sector. To reduce the environmental impact, cut down on car traffic and protect the natural beauty of the area, Isère Attractivité has partnered with the Alpes Là association to create 10 one- or two-day hiking itineraries accessible by public transport from Grenoble throughout Isère's main mountain ranges. These itineraries offer visitors an alternative and more responsible way to travel, filled with new discoveries and immersive experiences.

EDUCATION

environmentally friendly water bottles

Isère Attractivité is working to reduce plastic waste in tourism and leisure activities by partnering with businesses and organisations to focus on water resources and the use of water bottles.

Our goals are to: reduce the environmental impact of tourist activities and highlight their value; bring together professionals and organisations to work together on sustainable tourism projects; make it easier for tourist offices to participate in the Gourde Friendly (water bottle friendly) scheme; and help tourists and local residents reduce their use of plastic in their daily lives.

The #gourdefriendly project aims to make it easier to use water bottles by:

- Pointing out where water bottles can be refilled (by mapping drinking water fountains and premises that will refill).
- Improving the network of refilling points.
- Providing easier access to information for users.
- Expanding the range of services for people using water bottles.

By working hand-in-hand, Isère Attractivité and its partners can help make Isère a more sustainable destination for tourists and locals alike.

To help visitors enjoy the outdoors without damaging it, Isère Attractivité collaborates with partners to create informative articles on its website, offering insights on how to appreciate and look after nature. The key message is appreciating the value of exploring less crowded areas, equally stunning but with a gentler ecological footprint. Oisans, the snow sports capital of the Alps

Alpe d'Huez and Les Deux Alpes stand shoulder to shoulder as Isère's flagship destinations. Each with its own glacier and each with a ski area linked to other resorts, the queens of the Oisans have a reputation that stretches beyond France's borders. This winter, discover (or re-discover):

In Les Deux Alpes, the Vallée Blanche has been revamped with three new ski lifts and a new beginners' green run at Pied-Moutet.

At Alpe d'Huez, the French ski school (ESF) is launching its Ladies Camp, a 100% women's ski programme, while a new six-person chairlift linking the Bergers sector to Chalvet will speed up the flow of skiers and provide a better link to the Auris-en-Oisans sector opening up new runs.

Vercors, incomparable charm

The Vercors plateau is a vast area of natural beauty with over 600 km of cross-country ski trails. Its sheer size, variety of landscapes and village resorts make it a top choice for cross-country skiers of all abilities, as well as beginner and intermediate alpine skiers.

This sprawling farming area is also a leading advocate of short supply food chains that support local producers. This means fresh, regional produce is readily available at all times, something both restaurateurs and customers in the Vercors plateau have come to appreciate.

Grenoble, the city of the future

Grenoble is a city bursting with energy and innovation. With an average age of 37, it is a young and dynamic city that is constantly reinventing itself. As the gateway to the Alps, Grenoble is also a popular destination for both cultural travellers and also astronomy enthusiasts. In September 2022, Grenoble welcomed a new addition to its scientific community: COSMOCITÉ, an interactive centre that bridges the gap between science and the public. It will explore the Earth, the cosmos and the environment through a variety of exhibits, shows and workshops. The building itself is also a marvel of innovation. Powered by an 80% renewable energy urban heating system, with a green roof and photovoltaic panels, it is one of the most sustainable buildings in France.

Isère, responsible tourism

The tourism industry in Isère, especially in the mountains, is having to reinvent itself to tackle today's challenges head-on. The good news is that local areas and resorts are taking steps to make tourism more sustainable in a number of ways. Here are some of the practical initiatives that are already underway in Isère: using renewable energy, making ski lifts more energy-efficient, collecting and recycling waste, including shuttle buses on ski passes to reduce car use and sourcing food locally. By taking these steps, Isère is becoming a destination for responsible holidays.

Vercors

Overlooking Grenoble, the great cliffs that herald the Vercors give the impression that the massif is impregnable. This is partly true as steep summits and plunging gorges are everywhere. Yet the road that rises up from the valley ultimately opens out onto the rolling landscape of the Vercors plateau, where the forest alternates with large stretches of wilderness, dotted with unspoilt villages. A massif as complex as it is attractive. Highest point, the Grand Veymont, at 2 341 m.

Chartreuse

Above the Grésivaudan valley, this pre-Alpine massif looms on the horizon. Once you have entered its core, an intricate network of valleys, dominated by peaks of over 1,800 m, opens up its terrain, ideal for cross-country skiing and all kinds of hiking. The variety of landscapes, the authenticity of its villages and agriculture mix contributes to its rich heritage. A secret and unspoilt massif. Highest point, Chamechaude, 2,082 m.

Belledonne

The 70-km long Belledonne range is a great introduction to high mountains. Its side valleys offer numerous access points from the Grésivaudan plain in the west to the endless peaks above 2,400 m. However, don't expect to drive over any pass to the east: the natural barrier is impassable by car. This also explains why the snow is particularly deep here. Highest point, Le Grand Pic de Belledonne, 2,977 m..

Oisans

The most formidable of the Isère massifs, Oisans is a call to the high mountains with summits of 3,000 m +, with their glaciers, remote villages and high-altitude hamlets. The Oisans is home to the department's two largest ski areas, Alpe d'Huez Grand Domaine Ski and Les 2Alpes, offering a remarkable variety of slopes and the longest vertical drops in the world on well-groomed slopes - up to 2,300 m in one run. Highest point, the Pic Lory, 4,088 m.

Excellent skiing, extremely long vertical drops (2,300 m in one go without taking a single lift), guaranteed snow (glacier at 3,600 m), events, a freestyle area for all ages (2 Alpes Freestyle Land), and outstanding off-piste areas: the resort offers a winter playground that meets the needs of all types of winter holidaymakers with a wide variety of activities and experiences.

Les 2 Alpes

With its highest point at 3,600 m, the ski area of Les 2 Alpes is the highest ski area in France (starting from a blue run). It also allows you to ski down 2,300 m without any lifts! This is truly unique and offers a varied terrain for all skiers and snowboarders!

Key figures: 200 km of slopes, 95 runs, 70% of the ski area above 2,000 m altitude, 2,300 m of downhill skiing without taking a single lift. Highest point: 3,600 m.

SLIDING SPORTS

Vallée Blanche, a more accessible, efficient and environmentally friendly area

LES 2 ALPES - OISANS

The Vallée Blanche sector is getting a major upgrade to make it more accessible, efficient and environmentally friendly. By winter 2023, three new ski lifts will be completed and a new green beginners' slope will be built at Pied-Moutet. This will make the Vallée Blanche the ultimate skiing playground for everyone, regardless of their skill.

Nighttime ski descents will also be making a comeback. And skiers can hit the slopes after dark using the Super Venosc gondola or the Vallée Blanche telemix chairlift, then afterwards, enjoy an evening at the high-altitude restaurant La Troïka.

At the bottom of the sector, three free-access training areas will be created: Coolidge (1 conveyor, 1 ski lift) and Champamé (1 new ski lift). These areas will make it easier for skiers to learn and improve their skills.


A single, transferable season pass

High-altitude moments

LES 2 ALPES - OISANS

Pedestrians can now enjoy the same amazing views as skiers and snowboarders by taking the Jandri Express cable car from the resort to the Jandri Meadows at 3,200 m, and then the funicular to the Pic Blanc summit at 3,400 m. The views from the top are simply breathtaking, taking in the Ecrins massif, Belledonne, Vercors, Mont Blanc and even the Massif Central. Here, visitors can explore the ice cave or step into the void.

Starting in March, the Bureau de Guides offers glacier hikes from 3,000 m and beyond 3,400 m. Crampons and ice axes are required, but the 360-degree views are worth it. Even kids aged 10 and up can join in on these hikes.

Behind the scenes at a ski resort

LES 2 ALPES - OISANS

Get behind the scenes of a working ski resort with a couple of interesting outings. The pisteurs (mountain rescue team) take visitors out on Tuesday morning for training and operations (safety procedures, rescues, even how to trigger avalanches) and includes breakfast at 2,600 m. Then on Wednesday afternoon from 1:30 pm to 4:30 pm, the piste-basher (snowcat) takes passengers on a 30-minute joyride above 3,200 m.

Electric or airbound adventures

LES 2 ALPES - OISANS

Trail Hunter MTB specialises in guided e-mountain bike outings on snow with up to 400 m of vertical descent, with sliding and riding all rolled into one. Nighttime rides include a summit dinner.

Tandem paragliding is the coolest way to take in the scenery of the Ecrins and Vénéon rivers from the sky. Paragliders take off on skis from the Diable sector, at 2,400 m, and land at 1,650 m in the resort.

Four-season orienteering courses _

OZ 3300 - OISANS

Starting from the village of Oz and ending on the Lacs plateau, family or friends can grab a map and a compass, and head out on one of two winter orienteering courses following the forest trails. Along the trails, numerous markers hanging from the trees along the way help orienteers to identify wildlife and show where to stop to soak up the scenery in a variety of natural areas: clearings, viewpoints and stream banks.

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



Our initiatives include using renewable energy sources, making ski lifts more energy-efficient, collecting waste and recycling materials, grooming ski runs in a way that minimises soil erosion, offering free shuttle buses, protecting biodiversity and sourcing local food.

All of these measures are now ingrained in the daily life of Isère's resorts. It's now up to us, the people of Isère, to share this knowledge with our visitors and persistently motivate them to make responsible choices while they explore.



INFRASTRUCTURE

The new Jandri will soon be operational

LES 2 ALPES - OISANS

The Jandri Express, which has been in service for 39 years, will be replaced by the new Jandri 3S cable car in December 2024. Spanning a remarkable 6.4 km, the new cable car is designed to have less environmental impact and will significantly reduce queues and improve the flow of traffic on the mountain.

The communities of Deux-Alpes and Saint-Christophe-en-Oisans opted for more sustainable infrastructure for the new cable car. This included designing four discreet lift stations, using seven pylons instead of the current 17, burying power lines, re-greening with native plants, reducing energy consumption per passenger, removing outdated installations and using local materials.


Moreover, the on-site living arrangements for construction workers were set up to reduce the need for daily commutes, creating local job opportunities and a focus on sustainable practices.

Other initiatives:

- Closing ski lifts or adjusting their speeds depending on the number of visitors.
- Minimising the production of artificial snow.
- Training staff to reduce energy consumption and learn to eco-drive piste bashers.
- Using endemic seeds for turfing.
- Switching service vehicles to bioethanol.

VILLARD REYMOND - OISANS

For a unique and sustainable skiing experience, the village of Villard Reymond is the place to be. The ski area might be (extremely) small, but it has one remarkable feature: one solitary ski lift. What sets this lift apart, however, is its ingenious construction story. Local volunteers gathered salvaged lift components from various sources to build it. The lift officially holds safety certification by the STRMTG. Volunteers now run it, providing rides for just €7 a day: a fantastic example of how sustainability and innovation can go hand-in-hand.

Ski big by taking the lift

OZ 3300 - OISANS

With the new Eau d'Olle Express valley lift, the journey from the valley floor to Oz 3300 now takes just eight minutes, instead of the previous 20 minutes. This not only saves passengers time, but it also cuts down on the number of CO2 emissions. The lift has a capacity of 2,000 people per hour and a round-trip fare of only €1.70. Oz-en-Oisans welcomed the opening of its new gondola at the end of 2020, a breath of fresh air (literally) for locals and visitors alike. With light traffic, it is now possible to make the trip in 50 minutes from Grenoble to Oz 3300, where skiers can then easily access the 250 km of slopes at Alpe d'Huez Grand Domaine.

Serving the local area

Julien Rabat is head snowmaker for SATA whose offices are in the heart of Alpe d'Huez. He's open to anyone who has any questions about his job. Introduction.


Julien's job requires great versatility. Of course, there is the human aspect with team management. And there's the technical aspect regarding hydraulics and pneumatics. Julien Rabat is head snowmaker for the Société d'Aménagement Touristique de l'Alpe d'Huez et des Grandes Rousses (SATA). How exactly is snow made? "Cold water and pressurised air are sent through pipelines," Julien begins. The ambient temperature freezes the water as it is projected from the snow cannon. That's it? "Yes! There are lots of misconceptions about snowmaking. The three essential elements are water, air and cold temperatures. We don't use any chemicals. It's important to remember that." The SATA chief snowmaker's job has always had an educational aspect.

Using water wisely

Making artificial snow doesn't require chemicals, but it does require water. "That's the source of most of the criticism for the technique," admits Julien Rabat. "But it's important to point out that the water used comes from reservoirs that collect melted snow. We're also allowed to draw from Lac Blanc. But there is an official quota. We respect the limits carefully," he explains. What's more, modern snow grooming machines can accurately measure the thickness of artificial snow and distribute it for optimal use. This minimises the use of snow cannons.

Leaving a beautiful resort for future generations

"We can't do without artificial snow these days," Julien explains. "I wouldn't be able to bring up my daughters here in my homeland without skiing." As a father, preserving the natural environment is a priority. "The landscape is the first thing we see every morning when we open our shutters. I want my children to be able to go on living here if they wish." Is it possible? "We are constantly trying to improve snowmaking methods, for example by reducing energy consumption. Our goal is to leave a viable territory for future generations." That's enough to keep him focused and motivated for many years to come.





[PORTRAIT]

Christian the magician

Christian Sounier is the oldest snow groomer in Les 2 Alpes. And he's showing no signs of fatigue after forty-two years of grooming his resort's slopes to perfection for skiers. Read on.

"Winter sports are fantastic sources of adventure for both mountain locals and tourists," enthuses Christian Sounier. Born and bred in Les 2 Alpes, he has never thought of leaving his precious mountains. "I love the landscape, all the peace and beauty," he declares. And he chose to work in the resort, doing one of the crucial jobs. That's how he became a snow groomer in 1981. Forty-two years later, Christian tells us: "I've never found my job boring."

Making magic

Christian Sounier's job as a snow groomer is maintaining the snow cover on the slopes of the Les 2 Alpes resort. "I get my instructions at six in the evening and head for my zone until two in the morning. It must seem like magic to people when they get up and see the slopes," he smiles. The depth of the snow is perfect. It's smooth, fluid, magical. But it's not magic. It takes hard work and technique. "The equipment has improved a lot since I started. Grooming machines are very expensive these days, reaching €500,000. So handling them is a precise business. But the new technology consumes much less energy," he explains.

Encouraging green tourism

"Respect for the environment has become one of our priorities," Christian insists. "We make sure the flora and fauna recover their natural habitat at the end of the season." Our ethics also cover a wide range of tourism. Including tourism for summer holidaymakers who want to enjoy unspoilt nature. "After the pandemic, you could tell people needed to recharge their batteries. They come here for peace and natural beauty. The Alps are awe-inspiring, like an exciting book, with so many twists and turns you never want to put it down." And Christian will do everything to preserve his book.

ETHICAL ISÈRE

Introduced in 1964, this label advocates nature tourism. The national and official status is given to destinations which value their natural assets and have a shared vision of authentic tourism, respectful of local character. Involving local inhabitants reinforces the desired goal of this label, which has been awarded to 10 areas of Isère: Allevard, Auris-en-Oisans, Bourg-d'Oisans, Gresse-en-Vercors, Lans-en-Vercors, Les Deux-Alpes, Oz-en-Oisans, Roybon, Vaujany and Vénosc.

ECOLOGICALLY APPROVED

Developed by the association Mountain Riders to help resorts value their commitment to sustainability and encourage them to make ongoing improvements, this label is based on 21 strict criteria. It is awarded following an independent audit by a certified organisation. Currently, the label has been awarded to Chamrousse and Lans-en-Vercors, while Les Deux-Alpes has applied for it. However, many other resorts are taking action, at different levels, to improve their relationship with the environment.

SOFT MOBILITY

Road transport is one of the main producers of greenhouse gases. Tackling this problem in mountain areas requires a shift in behaviour, with more sustainable ways of transport required.

Bus travel: what are the advantages?

No restrictions linked to driving on snowy or frozen mountain roads, no special equipment needed (obligatory from November to March) and no need to install it, no problems with traffic jams, nor with parking.

Everyone can admire the countryside, substantial financial savings (petrol, tolls ... no breakdowns or prangs) and the carbon footprint for each passenger is low.



Tailor-made solutions _

SKILIGNE is a combined offer 'return by bus + ski pass' to enjoy a day in a resort. Serving six resorts, the service departs from Grenoble bus station, conveniently situated next to the train station: Alpe du Grand-Serre, Alpe d'Huez, Chamrousse, Les Deux-Alpes, 7 Laux and Villard-de-Lans.

At the foot of Les Deux-Alpes, a shuttle links Venosc with the Hydrelec Museum in Vaujany, with 13 stops along the way providing access to the Alpe d'Huez ski area.

Showcasing the mountain with respect

Michael Lafrasse conveys his passion for photography and the mountains in a click. But the blogger-photographer has another mission: instilling good practices in budding hikers. **Read on.**


Michael Lafrasse has always been an ardent hiker. "I'm very lucky. I've travelled all over the world. But Isère is the place that suits me best," insists this lover of mountain landscapes. He launched his Tas2cailloux blog in 2017 to raise awareness among urban locals about the surrounding paradise. The name is a reference to the famous cairns spotted along the trails he climbs with his camera in hand. His Instagram account abounds with stunning shots. "It's just a brisk walk with about 200 metres of elevation to reach stunning points of view, on snowshoes in winter," he explains.

More responsibilities

His invitation to simply enjoy nature has won many hearts. Michael's Instagram account now has 66,000 followers. His favourite hobby turned into a real job. "After the health crisis, people who benefited from my hiking tips in 2017 began criticising me for continuing to provide them," remarks the photographer. "I don't think overcrowding in certain places is the real problem. I think it's necessary to educate newcomers about the mountains, to give them good practices." One of the aims of his blog is to write articles reminding readers of the basic rules of hiking to show that virtuous tourism is possible. "Given my growing audience, I feel compelled to instil a sense of responsibility in future hikers. For example, I often mention that it's important to stay on the trails for safety and to avoid damaging the surroundings."

Take less risks

The same goes for photographers and other influencers who visit the Isère area. "Three years ago, I took a drone shot on the side of the Pas de l'Œille, above Villard-de-Lans. A lot of people saw it because it was quite spectacular. An influencer even came to the spot to take the same type of photo. But she sat on a snowdrift in the foreground, just above the void!" Michael explained to the young woman how risky it was. "There's no need to put yourself in danger to take a beautiful photo," he concluded. His reputation as a landscape photographer paved the way for his educational role. In the same vein, he also likes giving hikers, locals and tourists tips about less famous spots. "There are areas like the heart of Vercors near Autrans-Méaudre, or the south of Isère in Trièves that are less famous, but there are loads of beautiful spots there too!" advises this landscape connoisseur.



The hotel's restaurant, La Ferme d'Hubert, has limited meat dishes and offers a flexitarian menu - for which it was awarded a Michelin Green Star.

When it comes to gîtes and chambres d'hôtes (B&B), four labels are recommended by ADEME (The French Agency for Ecological Transition): European Ecolabel, Clef Verte (Green Key), Gîtes Panda et Ecogîte.

They have been built or renovated using techniques and materials that cause minimal impact to the environment, integrate with the countryside, have economical energy systems, use renewable energy, good water management and recycling etc.



Ears of a hawk

Alexandre Guhéry has the ears of a hawk. This enigmatic title refers to his twofold activity as a mountain guide and a pianist who listens to the landscape. He guides hikers through the Chartreuse massif in an unprecedented way: with their ears. Introduction

The branches crack under the weight of the snow. The snow crushes under your snowshoes. Covering the nature with soothing peace. Alexandre Guhéry proposes hikers discover the mountain with an often-neglected sense: our hearing. Before he became a mountain guide, Alexandre was a pianist. In fact, he still is. He decided to combine his two passions in one activity: the "piano hike".

The first piano hike

"First and foremost, I'm a pianist. When I became a mountain guide, I considered my two professions separately," explains the musician. He was passing through magnificent scenery in the Chartreuse massif when he began dreaming of concerts surrounded by nature. "I wanted to push beyond the typically strict boundaries of classical piano."

Winter 2021 The mountain resorts were closed to the public during the second lockdown. "That's when I organised my first winter piano hike. I organised a concert in my small music room after a snowshoe excursion in the mountains surrounding my house in Saint-Pierred'Entremont." recalls Alexander. He had all the ingredients.

Listen to nature

When the season's right, Alexandre Guhéry moves his instrument into majestic landscapes. He guides winter hikes which prepare his audience for listening to a concert in a warm barn or cottage. He chooses the setting to ensure the intimate atmosphere he prefers. "I play all the pieces without stopping so the audience receive a stream of music. I am very proud to note that even amateurs - and that's the majority of my audience - appreciate experiencing music outside the ultra-conventional setting of a concert hall," exclaims the pianist with enthusiasm.

Alexandre uses the walk before the concert to prepare his audience's ear for the music. "I suggest my audience take their time and lower their heart rate and mental pace to develop their sense of hearing." The aim of the hike is not physical performance. It's an episode suspended in time so the body can make itself available to the environment. It's perfect for forgetting your everyday hassles and the material world.

At the Cueillette des Sommets farm, 2 km from the col d'Ornon, visitors learn about red fruits with strange names, 'bear's garlic' and génépi (liqueur made with mountain herbs). Exploring the laboratory, guests gain insight into the process before indulging in the tasting of the farm's organic products. Ecocert certified and approved by Nos Produits IsHere. Statistics of sustainable tourism: key figures and trends 2023 - 14/03/2023

Holidaymakers are becoming more and more interested in eating and buying local produce during their stay in Isère. This trend, widely supported by restaurateurs, has led to an increase in addresses which promote and sell specialities by local producers. The label Nos Produits IsHere has been created to support this.

Every Thursday in winter, local artisans and producers involved in sustainable activities meet in the market at **Chamrousse 1650**. Jam, beer, cheese, soap: the choice is huge, like that in the deli Le Caïrn de **Vaujany**, which puts ethical practices, organic products and quality at the top of its list. On the other side of the valley, **in Les 2 Alpes**, the Vieux Chalet and the Fromagerie des Alpes offer crozets (local pasta), authentic dried sausages and many more items to delight the senses. At the Biscuiterie du Vercors, in **Villard-de-Lans**, artisans Vincent and Nicolas make delicious biscuits without preservatives, additives or dyes.

The best of Isère is found where it's made...

In Lans-en-Vercors, Grand'Mèche farm sells its homemade cheeses bleu du Vercors, bleu de Sassenage and other dairy products; while the farm of Pic Saint-Michel focuses on goat's and sheep's cheese. Still in the Vercors, in **Méaudre**, Reines des Prés, owned by two young farmers, produces beef and veal, as well as chicken and eggs. At the Ferme des Colibris, cows and pigs are raised organically.

As for drinks, it's all about plants and fruits from Isère and elsewhere

In the microbrewery L'Albinche de **l'Albenc**, local barley is used and the beer is brewed by hand. At Biercors in **Villard-de-Lans**, they produce organic drinks, beers and juices. At L'Entropie in **Autrans-Méaudre**, liqueurs and spirits made with plants and fruits from the Vercors are created in secret. Yonder Café in **Les 2 Alpes**, at an altitude of 1 650 m, roasts its own coffee from Guatemala, Peru, Indonesia and Ethiopia.



'Nos produits IsHere': Isère marks its territory

The 'Nos Produits IsHere' label is the first of its kind in France, which at the same time guarantees the origin of the local produce, respect for good farming practices and animal welfare, and fair pay for producers. This label showcases the rich array of farming diversity and the skilled craftsmanship of artisans in Isère. Fruit, vegetables, meat, fish, honey, dairy products (including cheese, obviously): everything is sold in most of the supermarkets in the département and direct from the producers.

Ski instructor, farmer and teacher

Dialogue is important for **Quentin Argoud** Puy in both of his professions as a farmer and a ski instructor. Aware of the importance of exchange, he chooses his words carefully when describing his deep love for his massif: the Vercors.


Quentin Argoud Puy has always been conscious of his taste for teaching, even before he became a farmer and ski instructor in Villard-de-Lans. "It's important to be able to explain your relationship with the mountain these days. As a young dairy farmer, it's crucial to communicate effectively with the local population. The mountain can be shared with respect for the life around us," suggests the young man. Tourism is another important parameter that must be taken into account. "Life here wouldn't be the same without tourism. But we need to find the right balance."

A virtuous local movement

Reconnecting farmers and local residents. Finding a balance between tourism and local life. "They are the important issues for the next ten years," Quentin explains. And he's confident. Many other farmers of his generation have a similar attitude. The agriculture sector in the area is very dynamic. Tourism is undergoing a virtuous transformation. "Villard-de-Lans has the advantage of being a village first and a ski resort second." he points out. In other words, life goes on even when there's no snow, with cultural events and gastronomic activities, for example. The young farmer is also thinking about creating a discovery trail at the family farm, Aux Champs Derrière where his father, uncle and younger brother also work. "We plan to open a cheese factory in autumn 2023, where we will sell our blue Vercors Sassenage cheese made on the farm with our cows' milk," Quentin announced. "Consumers want to understand what they eat and I want to show them how it all works." Always teaching.

Skiing and people

Like his father, Quentin Argoud Puy combines his job as a ski instructor with work on the farm. The young man has been teaching skiing in Villard-de-Lans since he was 17. "I'm a big fan of dialogue. I like to be able to explain things in an accessible way to a very different audience. There are all ages, all levels. The psychological side is fascinating. All aspects of being human are engaged when learning how to ski. The difference in progress varies enormously depending on the degree of apprehension!" exclaims Quentin with enthusiasm. When I asked Quentin what he likes most about skiing, he responded spontaneously, "Pleasure, freedom, the sensations that come with speed. But what I like most of all is that everyone can do it, because you can regulate your speed. Skiing is for everyone. We're all together but each person does it their own way, according to their personal taste."



GRENOBLE, ULTRA CAPITAL OF THE ALPS

With a population whose average age is 37* Grenoble is buoyed by the youth of its inhabitants and the projects they create.

Not only is Grenoble the gateway to the Alps, the city is a popular stop for holidaymakers who are looking for some culture or who want to voyage to the stars. Marking a significant autumn event for the local scientific community, COSMOCITÉ is set to launch on September 30, 2023. This initiative aims to bridge the gap between the public and the world of science. Through engaging and interactive exhibits, visitors will embark on a journey to unravel the wonders, enigmas and environmental challenges encompassing Earth, the universe and beyond.

The centre is firmly geared towards ecology. The building is connected to the city's heating, which uses 80% of renewable or recovered energy. It also has a living roof, which helps isolate and retain water. To encourage even more durability, 20 m2 of solar panels have been fitted to the roof, assisting the production of its own energy.

ACCESSIBLE CULTURE

FOR ALL

Eleven public museums in Isère (https://musees.isere.fr/) all offer free entry, giving visitors the opportunity to combine snow-based fun with cultural and historical experiences during their holiday. Four unmissable exhibitions this season include:

Musée Dauphinois in Grenoble presents Alpins: 7,000 years of history, an immersive exhibition from 11 October 2023. Visitors can learn about the history of the Alps, where inhabitants have had to adapt to the challenges of the environment. The mountain people have continually been in contact with the outside world, witnessing exchanges and human movement throughout the ages. Today's Alpine world is a desirable refuge from a changing way of life and environment issues. The visit is enriched by an innovative exhibition with animations, relief maps and information screens, creating an entertaining and educational experience ideal for young people.

Musée Bergès in Villard-Bonnot, the exhibition of Gustave Eiffel, the ingenious engineer runs from 30 September 2023 to 3 March 3024. Commemorating the 100th anniversary of his death, the exhibition highlights the creativity and daringness of Gustave Eiffel, the visionary engineer who left his mark on the turn of the 19th and 20th century by firmly believing in the technique of progress. The exhibition also explores his lesser-known work in the Grenoble area.

Musée Arcabas de St Pierre de Chartreuse, exhibition of Audacity and Renewal, 70 years of St Hugues runs until 31 March 2024. It celebrates the reopening of Saint-Hugues en Chartreuse church in 1953 after a daring transformation by young painter Jean-Marie Pirot. His modern artworks stand out for their coherence with the architecture, a refreshing contrast with the natural environment outside. The exhibition pays homage to these striking works with photos, preliminary designs and lithographs made by Pirot to finance his exciting project.

Musée de la Révolution française (Museum of the French Revolution), in the Domaine de Vizille, presents a new exhibition, Style Révolution française, which showcases the simplicity, elegance and refinement of the decorative arts at the end of the 18th century. It highlights a 'French Revolution style' during the Liberty years following the fall of the Bastille (1789 to 1792) and the first years of the Republic (1792-1799). For the first time, the public can see some of the wallpaper made by Réveillon in Paris, dating from 1790. A remarkable collection of sculpted chairs by Georges Jacob and a desk designed by Adam Weisweiler, is on loan from the Mobilier National (French National Furniture Institution). These design trends adhere to the spirit of The Enlightenment, a movement which mixed rationalism with emancipation at the end of the 18th century. This unmissable exhibition is on until 11 March 2024.

Refuge de l'abbaye de Laval Bénite _____

SAINT-PIERRE-DE-BRESSIEUX

The owners have completely renovated this magnificent old farmhouse using traditional techniques and natural materials. It's the ideal accommodation for family gatherings or New Year parties as it can sleep up to 15 people. Stepping into the abbey grounds is stepping into nature. Staying at the refuge is a great opportunity to see a herd of rare Vercors horses, bred by the owners. Riders and their steeds are particularly welcome here, as are those wanting to host well-being retreats.




